Methodology

- Benenson Strategy Group conducted 829 online interviews nationwide from September 20-24, 2024 among women who are registered voters.
- The margin of error for the dataset overall is +/- 3.4% at the 95% confidence level and is higher among subgroups.
- Due to rounding, some percentages may not add up to 100%.
- Shorthand terms:
 - Parent <18: Parent of children younger than 18
 - Parent 18+: Parent of children older than 18
 - Right Wing News: Those who watch Fox News and/or media outlets like Newsmax, One America News Network ("OAN"), Breitbart, etc.





5 Key Takeaways



In a turbulent and high-profile election cycle, women are highly engaged with the upcoming November election and are tuning into politics at a higher rate than usual. Nearly half of women say this will be the most important election of their lifetime.

Vice President Harris has a 15-point lead over former President Trump with women nationally, and women believe Harris will win by the same margin. Independent women favor Harris by 18 points.



Women trust the Democratic ticket to address their top issue of inflation and bring down the cost of living. The Harris-Walz team has worked to gain a reservoir of trust not only on important issues – including on abortion and immigration – but also on leadership qualities across the board: who cares about people like you, who will be a strong leader, and who will make the country a better place for future generations.



There is also a lot of excitement about electing America's first female president. An overwhelming majority of voters think it's important to elect more women to political office and 6 in 10 think the government gets more done when there are more women holding political office. A strong majority also insists the country is more open to a woman president than 8 years ago when Hillary Clinton ran, driven mostly by Democrats and Black women.



Despite recent attacks on reproductive rights, including abortion, birth control and IVF, voters are strongly supportive of ensuring access to anyone who needs it. A strong majority of women think abortion should be legal and available, without the government being involved, and want contraception and fertility treatments to be accessible and affordable.



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

And Independent women are much more favorable to Harris than they are to Trump Favorability




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Harris enjoys a 15-point margin with women in both voter horserace and predicted horserace

Presidential horserace and predicted win








Women open to voting for Harris cite her values and plans for the future, while women open to Trump think he is more capable and would be better for their financial situation




Reasons to vote Trump

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Women trust Harris and Walz more on top issues such as abortion and inflation, though their advantage shrinks on immigration


Trust in presidential tickets, issues

Trust in presidential tickets, qualities and values








Women resoundingly disapprove of Trump's leadership style, though 1 in 4 younger voters and parents with young kids still support his policies



While a majority think Trump and Vance's comments about women are offensive, a sizeable chunk think it's overblown – showing continued resilience from verbal gaffes




Political Engagement and Discourse

In a very turbulent election cycle, interest in politics has increased for most, especially for both young and old women voters




With breaking news seemingly constant, engagement numbers are up across the board, particularly among older, Democratic women and those with grown children Political engagement

Everything going on this election cycle has made me feel more disengaged and more tuned out from politics than usual.


Change in % "more engaged" since 2023




Similar to 2023, the plurality of women who don't talk politics frequently cite lack of interest, but 1 in 3 say it's too confrontational

Thinking about your friends or family, either in person, online, or over the phone, how often would you say you talk about politics or current events with them?











About half of women in serious relationships are in a "mixed household" when it comes to political ideology – which means there are sometimes disagreements on issues Ideology within relationships

Pressure to think/vote based on partner's politics








In an election year there is certainly more anxiety about the country's current state though there is also more hope

Which TWO of the following best describe your feelings about how things are going in the US right now?







Most important issues when deciding whom to vote for





% Pessimistic about the economy



Personal financial situation




Thinking about the last couple of years, has your personal financial situation...?






Burnout remains widespread, with increases since the pandemic Burnout








The vast majority continue to believe abortion should be available and not limited by the government




Women continue to overwhelmingly believe abortion should be legal in at least most cases, and Republican women's views have softened

Reproductive care accessibility


How important is it for birth control / IVF to be available and affordable to anyone who needs it?



Thinking about the number of women in political office, which is closer to your view?







Do you think the country is more open to a woman president today than it was eight years ago when Hillary Clinton ran?




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
